
Recent Happenings...Club & Individual Awards and Decorations

Hint of Honey Pumpkin Spread

Health & Nutrition A Continuing Series

Using pure pumpkin in your recipes adds valuable fiber and Vitamin A while significantly reducing fats and sodium in your recipes.

Add a touch of pumpkin to any party by whipping up this creamy spread. This light and airy variation of a cream cheese is subtly sweet with a delicate hint of honey, which makes it perfect for both sweet and savory uses. Try it with veggies, crackers or fruit:

Ingredients— 1 pkg (8 oz) 1/3 less fat cream cheese (Neufchatel), at room temperature

1/2 cup LIBBY'S 100% Pure Pumpkin

2 tablespoons honey

1 pinch ground cinnamon

Directions— STIR cream cheese, pumpkin, honey and cinnamon in medium bowl for 1 minute

or until smooth. Serve

Immediately or refrigerate in tightly covered container for up to 4 days. Make about 1 1/3 cups.

SERVE— with apple slices or whole-wheat crackers

Makes about ten 2 tablespoon servings







Know the Basics of a Good, Healthy Eating Plan

Type II Adult Onset diabetes is the fastest growing health threat to Americans today. Healthy eating and regular physical activity are important in managing your type 2 diabetes because they can lower your blood sugar, blood pressure, cholesterol, and triglycerides, as well as help control your weight. It's important to know that you don't have to change your entire life to begin eating properly. In fact, simply by reading up on good ways to eat healthy, you will be well on your way to making positive changes to your health.

Know the basics of a good healthy eating plan

The best healthy eating plan for type 2 diabetes is one that helps you reach all of your goals and is realistic for you. No two healthy eating plans are the same. However, there are some basics everyone should keep in mind.

Choose wisely:

- Choose a variety of foods, especially those that contain carbohydrates and fiber, such as whole grains, beans, vegetables, and fruit.
- You should eat foods that contain protein, such as meat, fish, poultry, beans, nuts, and cheese.
- Saturated fat (animal fat) and *trans* fats (partially hydrogenated vegetable oils, such as hard margarine and shortenings) should be limited, but some unsaturated fat (oil from vegetables and fish) is healthy.
- Sweets are okay if you eat them in moderation and balance them with healthy choices in other food groups.
