How Emergency Medical Services Division (EMS) Responds to Save Lives" by members of the Rochester Fire Department's EMS crew. The Fire Department has five fire stations: one in the center of the city and four stations located in each corner

area of the city. Also there is a mutual aid agreement with all bordering communities. They a re a combination department with full-time firefighter / paramedics and paid-on-call firefighter / EMTs who provide emergency response, as well as full-time administrative staff who provide additional support. (24 Hours / 7 days a week)
