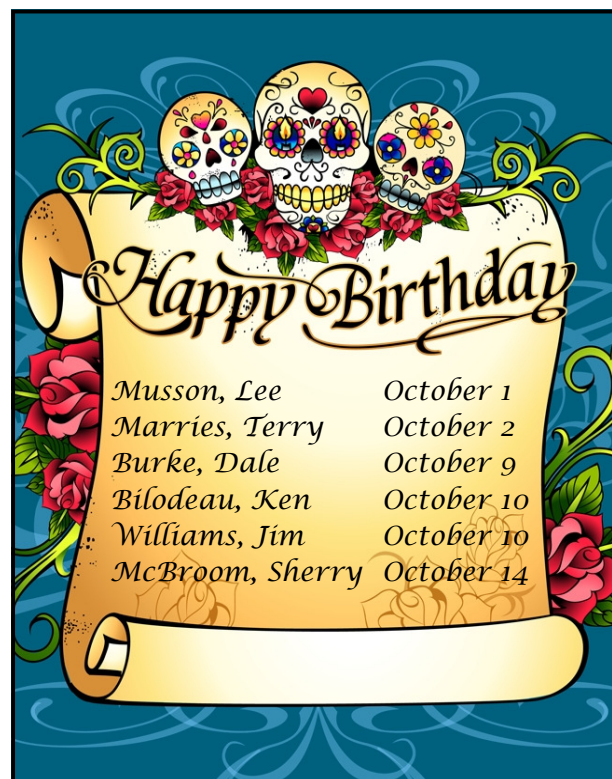

Papa Joes Wine and Beer tasting

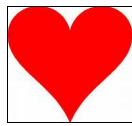

She went on speaking about The Paint Creek Center for the Arts which is located at 507 Pine Street in Rochester and was started in 1965. This organization was created to enhance life in this region by promoting, encouraging and creating opportunities to participate in and appreciate the arts. The building serves nearly 1,000 students of art each year. It also has a unique exhibition program and has nearly 250 professional artists featured in their exhibition each year. The building also houses a gift gallery. Diane ended her speech by stating that art touches us all in one way or another.

Number of participants was 5,277 in total.

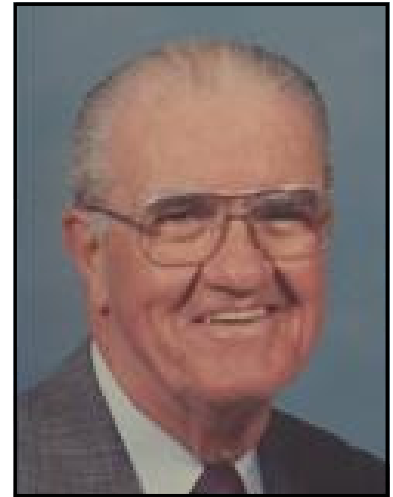


Lion. David Joseph Padilla
