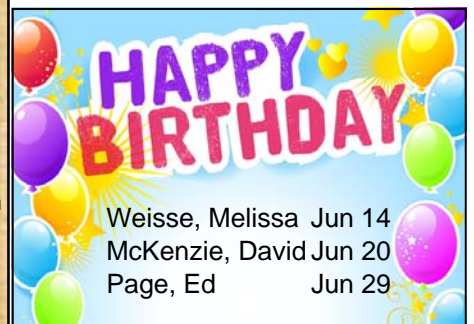
See you all there for a good gathering.

**Speaker of the day.** On May 5, Lion Deb Motley introduced our speaker, Dr. George Portic, Pastor of University Presbyterian Church speaking on "Life in a Changing Russia".

Dr Portic via a slide show and verbal presentation gave a interesting view of Russia today. Some interesting items about Russia were: there are Lions Clubs in Russia, 83% of the people claim to be Christian, Putin is a Christian and attends church, churches are now being repaired and refurbished after the old Communist regime used them to store grain etc., the Russian government is giving the churches back to the people, lots of young people attend church, the Priests are all young people as the old Communist regime killed the old ones off. He went on with many other observations from having traveled extensively there. He ended with the following "Russia is no longer what it used to be". A question and answer period followed.



**Speaker of the day.** On May 19. After dinner Lion Bates formally introduced our speakers who represent The Rochester/Auburn Hills Community Coalition that is a volunteer, collaborative organization of area residents, professionals, business leaders and community leaders. They are dedicated to supporting healthy life styles, preventing and reducing substance abuse, and promoting safety across all sectors of the community.

Their efforts and programs are primarily focused on youth, but include adult awareness of the factors influencing our community's children – including peer pressure and parental behaviors – and providing support in resolving the issues we all face. Some of the areas covered were learning what problems youth of today face, how to interpret what is going on in their lives and assist them. Many pamphlets were made available to members to take home. Smoking, alcohol, bullying and substance abuse are big problems today. The program ended with a question and answer period.
